Interrupted Cities: the morphology of Istanbul's waterfront è la seconda edizione di un Workshop Internazionale di Architettura promosso dalla Facoltà di Architettura e Design della Ózyegin University, Istanbul, Turchia, al quale sono stati invitati a partecipare i Proff. Giuseppe Arcidiacono e Alberto De Capua con una rappresentanza di 4 studenti del Dipartimento di Architettura e Territorio dell'Università *Mediterranea* di Reggio Calabria. La partecipazione al workshop e la sistemazione in alloggio presso la sede turca ospitante è gratuita; non sono comprese le spese relative al viaggio e al vitto.

Le aree e i temi di progetto investono il waterfront di Istanbul.

Gli studenti dopo aver effettuato il sopralluogo sulle aree indicate elaboreranno le soluzioni progettuali seguiti dai docenti di riferimento. Le attività laboratoriali saranno accompagnate da lezioni e comunicazioni a cura della sede universitaria turca.

Il bando è aperto a numero 4 studenti iscritti al Corso di Laurea Magistrale del dArTe. La partecipazione è consigliata a studenti che abbiano già sostenuto l'esame del Laboratorio di Progettazione Architettonica 1.

Per la partecipazione al workshop è previsto il riconoscimento di **3 crediti F**.

La partecipazione all'iniziativa avviene attraverso una procedura selettiva. Alla selezione si accede presentando i seguenti materiali: portfolio in formato A4 del proprio curriculum vitae et studiorum (con l'indicazione della conoscenza della lingua inglese); rendiconto degli esami sostenuti con i relativi voti; un secondo portfolio - in formato A3 orizzontale - contenente i progetti elaborati dallo studente in corsi universitari e workshop. I frontespizi di tali materiali dovranno riportare i dati anagrafici, l'indirizzo email e un numero telefonico del candidato. I materiali richiesti, inseriti in busta chiusa, dovranno essere consegnati presso il protocollo del dArTe entro le **ore 12.00 del 04 febbraio 2020**. 

Aims

The workshop focuses on the architectural survey and redesign of selected urban blocks of Galata, we should not conceive these blocks as arbitrary objects, like in most contemporary architectural production, but rather as living organisms within the *formation* process of urban tissues. The single building designed by each student is therefore part of a *larger scale organism* and contributes with its physical consistence to the definition of a *part of the city*. The projects will therefore adhere to the principles of the construction of an environment suitable not only for private functions, but also for social activities. The workshop focuses on the theme of **Galata-Beyoglu Waterfront** considering its **ongoing** transformation. The area is indeed an important connection point between the sea and the historical Galata neighbourhood, acting as the city's "urban facade" towards the sea. The workshop will include also an advanced experimentation in **digital survey** technologies and procedures

Methodology

The workshop considers critically the recent problems of the contemporary metropolis in Istanbul, the substitution of **historical urban tissues** with new buildings. In the past ten years, the frenetic building activity has obliterated historical urban tissues, replacing them with new functions and spatial layouts, inserting different building types within a consolidated **historical urban tissue**. This activity has caused in some cases the opposition of part of the local population. The city growth has always requested a processual substitution of building types with updated ones. This *restructuring activity* is not a modern one: we can enumerate similar examples in ancient and mediaeval times. The workshop will focus on the waterfront of **Galata-Beyoglu** as a case study about the transformation of the **contemporary metropolis**, within an ongoing scientific research on that district. The workshop considers the transformation of urban tissues both inevitable and necessary, but distinguishes two different operative modes: an *evolution in continuity* with the diachronic transformations of the context, or a *substitution*, in complete opposition. Students will design, after discussing with the teaching team, selected blocks within the medieval Genoese waterfront, and therein will conduct advanced analysis in the field of **urban morphology**, determining the adequate way to redesign them as a National public Library.


